Introduction to TCCC Changes Summary

he most recent addition of the TCCC guidelines, dated 5 November 2020, contains a number of updates based on changes approved by the Committee on TCCC (CoTCCC) in the past several years.

There were seven separate changes considered and approved by the CoTCCC, addressing a variety of topics such as tranexamic acid, fluid resuscitation, prehospital analgesia, tourniquets, eviscerating abdominal injuries, and hypothermia prevention.

This article contains a brief summary of the highlights of these recent changes.
